University Square Owners Association Security Camera Policy

The purpose of installing a security camera system should be to monitor one's personal property.

The University Square Owners Association Board of Directors has adopted the following policy in regards to the installation, placement, and use of personal security cameras. If one is planning to install a security camera system (on the exterior of your property), an Architectural Application must first be submitted to and approved by the Architectural Committee. Approvals will be based on the following guidelines.

- Security cameras installed must be used to capture video ONLY. It is against the law to record audio without the consent of the parties being recorded.
- Cameras should be installed no higher than 8 feet (2.4 meters) off of the ground when facing a neighboring property.
- Cameras may be installed higher than 8 feet (2.4 meters) off of the ground when the camera is facing a public area (e.g. street or park).
- Cameras need to be placed in the least intrusive or visible location.
- Cameras must be pointed in the direction to monitor only the homeowner's immediate property.
- Cameras should not be directed towards a neighboring property (i.e. never directed at windows of adjacent structures, neighboring backyard or common area property.)
